The Klan Cracks.

While rivals for control of Ku Klux Klan funds are fighting out their quarrels in Georgia courts, branches of the order in Louisiana are quietly bygones up and standing.

At two towns in the Polk State Klansmen, Protestant ministers and Knights of Columbus directed by Catholic Priests have met around counsel tables, exchanged views and published statements touching the process of the Klan's dissolution.

Recently, these statements consist of declarations by Klansmen that they joined the order for patriotic purposes and without prejudice against Catholics or Jews, and of assurances by Catholics and Protestants alike that these avowals should be accepted in good faith by the community. The pronouncements close with an appeal for all good citizens to forget the past and unite on the old ground of a citizenship free of religious or racial intolerance.

Signs like these indicate that the end of the Ku Klux Klan is not far off.

From the outset The Courier-Journal has not doubted that the organization would wear itself out against the ingrained conservatism of American character. The order's misguided members are recognizing that this order has no rightful place in American life. The wonder is that it ever gained a foot hold in the conservative South, where inter-relations of Jews, Catholics and Protestants have been exemplary for more than a century.—From the Louisville Courier-Journal.

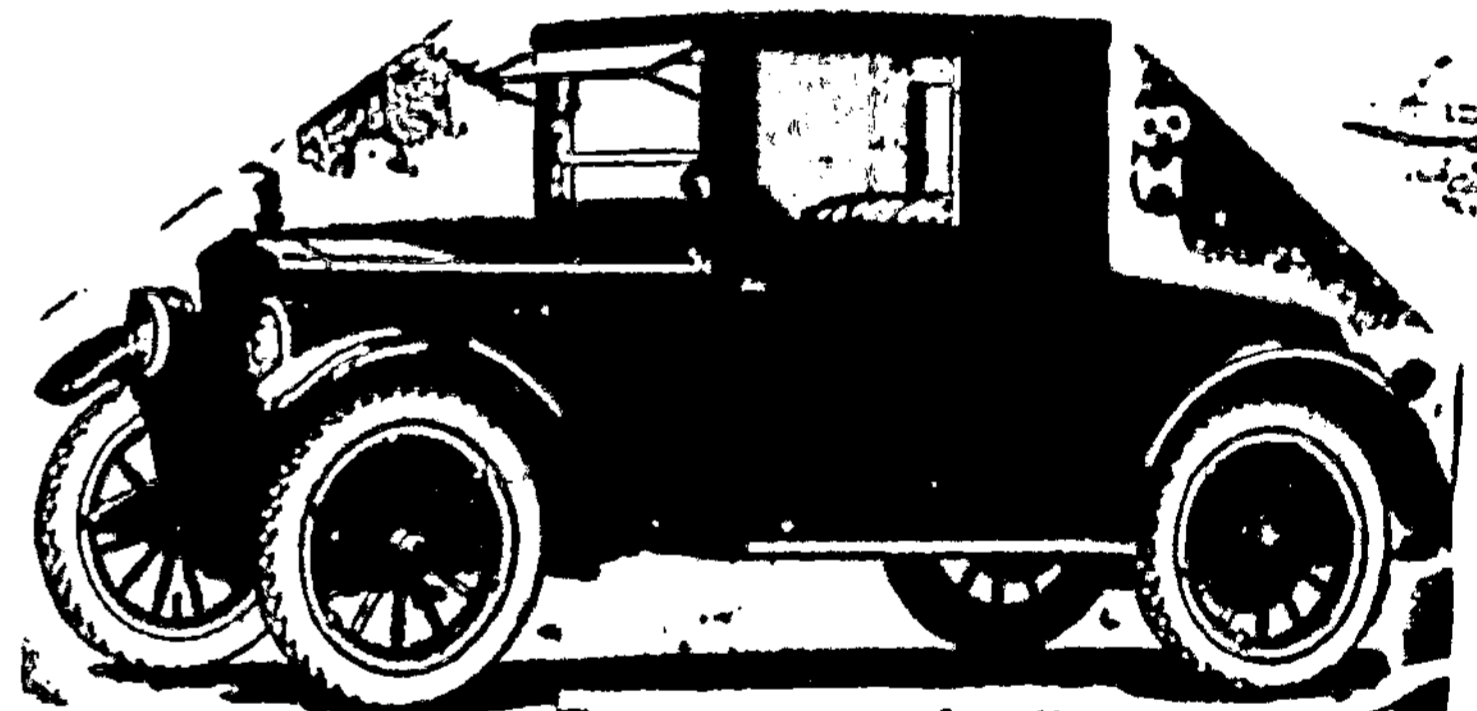
