Mines Sold.

ANOTHER HIGH NOGAL PROPERTY PASSES INTO HANDS OF CHICAGO CAPITALISTS.

For some time past a deal has been on foot for the purchase of the famous Hellen Rae group of mines near Nogal, and we are glad to announce that the property has passed into other hands, Messrs Dolph & Robertson having sold the property to a syndicate represented by J. M. Rice. The full particulars of the deal has not been learned here and perhaps will not be until Mr. Rice's return some time this week.

The Chicago Record of July 15, gives the information that the Eagle Mining company of Nogal have purchased the Old Abe gold mine and the Old Abe Coal mine at White Oaks. Mr. Rice, the general manager of the Eagle company is now in Chicago, but was expected home this week. Rumors of all kinds of mining deals are afloat but we will give out nothing that is not authentic.

A bill has been reported favorably by the senate committee on mines and mining amending the laws relating to the location of mineral lands. The amendment gives locators the exclusive right of possession of all surface land within their lines and "veins, lodes, etc." throughout the entire depth which lie within such surface lines, extending downward vertically. Locations are to be 1,500 feet square in all cases in which previous locations do not prevent. The existing legal provision concerning tunnels is repealed. The present law in regard to locations gives an area of 600x1,500 feet, but does not permit following a vein outside of the lines. The effect of the proposed amendment would be to extend the area and confine mining with in the surface lines vertically extended. The bill is an improvement on the existing law applying to location of mineral lands.

The largest air compressor used in any mine in New Mexico is being put in place at the American mine.

Albert Pfingsten has a contract to run a fifty foot tunnel on one of the Turkey Creek properties.

A company is being organized here to work placer ground in the Jicarilla mountains.

W. A. McIvers returned Saturday from Flat Top mountain where the New Mexico Oil and Development company are prospecting for oil. He reports the well down to a depth of over three hundred feet and the prospects for oil most favorable.

Uncle George Hust has sold his mining claims at the head of Nogal canyon for a pretty large sum of money and is now absent visiting some of his children in Idaho. Uncle George waited quite a while but knew he had a good thing and held on until he got a sum of money sufficient for him to live in ease and plenty the rest of his days.

The "gold of Ophir" was scarcely more than "small change" as compared with the gold of the United States. The national treasury showed an increase of \$8,500,000 during the month of June, and on the last day of the month stood at \$559,302,051. This is a new record and far discounts the \$515,000,000 held in the Bank of France, the next greatest gold stock in the world. This steady accretion of the precious metal in the United States treasury is paralleled by the gain in the general circulation. A leading authority in finance estimates that the general stock of gold in this country now approaches one and one quarter thousand millions, the estimate of two years ago. Moreover, this same authority ventures the prediction that by 1912 the gold held in the United States will aggregate two thousand millions.

The constant output of our gold mines is one powerful factor, but a still greater one is our enormous trade balance, which will certainly be largely added to if the crop expectations as they now stand are justified in the harvest.

Nogal and Bonito Mining Districts.

The Nogal mining district or mineral belt, is about ten miles square, reaching from the Rock Island railroad on the north to the divide between Rio Bonito and Nogal canyon on the south, and from the town of Nogal to the west side of Nogal range of mountains.

The Bonito mining district lays south of the Nogal district and extends southward to the north line of the Mesquero Indian reservation, and west from Bonito City for a distance of about ten miles. The famous Parsons mine is about the center of the great mineral belt. These two districts can show up better surface prospects than any like area in the southwest and can offer better inducements to intending purchasers.

There is already great activity in mining matters around Nogal and the ball is just beginning to roll.

The Free Gold Mining company have received all their machinery and expect to start up their plant today, Thursday.

Geo. W. Harbin, president of the Free Gold Mining company left for Waterloo, Iowa, Wednesday. He will be absent in the east for about one month.

A new mining company has been organized here the past week, composed of good men, to work some valuable Lincoln county mining property. Particulars later.

Four months ago American stock was selling for 40 cts per share, now it is worth more than double that amount with but little found for sale at any price.

With the American, Hellen Rae Parsons, Free Gold, and other rich properties at work Nogal is going to be the best mining camp in New Mexico. We have the mineral to back the assertion.

Most of the capital coming into the Nogal mining district is from, Illinois, Iowa, Kansas, Missouri, Ohio, Michigan, Minnesota, Wisconsin and Nebraska. The northern capital and enterprise is what made Cripple Creek the best gold camp on earth; and Nogal's prospects are good to come in a close second to the golden giant at the foot of Pike's Peak.

Saw mills are at work on the vast forests of pine in the Gallinas and hundreds of thousands of railroad ties have been taken out of there. The Nogal lodge, K. of P. will initiate five new candidates Saturday night.

Mrs. J. B. Walters, of La Luz is a guest at the Brown hotel this week. Mr. Walters is a carpenter at the Parsons mine.

A. H. Hudspeth; for a long time book keeper for the V.V. cattle outfit, has formed a partnership with John Y. Hewitt of White Oaks, for the practice of law and will move to that place about August 1st.

A large number of teams are busy hauling coal and freight from Walnut station to the mines. Pfingsten brothers have the contract for hauling about five hundred thousand pounds of machinery to the American and Parsons mines and have already started to moving it.

John Carico, while prospecting on Little Bear canyon last week, killed an old bear and one cub. One cub escaping. Last Saturday two men killed two bear on the South Fork of the Bonito. It is believed that recent forest fires in the Capitan mountains have drove herds of bear out of that section to the Bonito country.

Parties wishing to enter a newspaper office at this season should be governed by the following rules:

Advance to the inner door and give three distinct raps, or kick the door down. The "devil" will attend to the alarm. You will give him your name, post-office address and the number of years you are owing for the paper. He will admit you. You will advance to the center of the room and address the editor, with the following countersign: Extend the right hand about two feet from the body, with the thumb and index finger clasping a \$10 bill which drops into the extended hand of the editor, at the same time saying: "Were you looking for me?" The editor will grasp your hand and the bill and pressing it will say "You bet!" After giving the news of your locality you will be permitted to retire with a receipt for an obligation properly discharged.

Any person who has heretofore made a homestead entry and commuted under section 2 shall be entitled to the benefits of the homestead laws, as though such former entry had not been made. Any person who, prior to the passage of the new law had made a homestead entry but from any cause has lost or forfeited the same; shall be entitled to the benefits of the homestead laws as though former entry had not been made. Therefore you will not hereafter reject a homestead application on the grounds that the applicant cannot take the prescribed oath that he has previously made such entry, or because he has perfected title under section 301, revised statutes, to land entered under the homestead law; but he will be required to show by affidavit designating the entry formerly made by description of the land, number and date of entry, or other sufficient data, to enable me to identify the same on the records of this office, and that it was forfeited or commuted, as the case may be, prior to the passage of the present act.—U. S. Land Office Circular, 1900.

E. W. Hulbert, of Lincoln, in company with Mr. McKinney of Kansas, passed through town Tuesday en route to White Oaks.

A horse race between horses owned by Clark Hyst and W. M. Ferguson will come off at Nogal Saturday, the wager being \$100, 40 a side.

John H. Canning and family and A. Schinzing and wife passed through town Monday en route home at White Oaks after an outing on the Bonito.

A campmeeting began at Nogal this week to last until July 27. The camp grounds are in Nogal canyon one mile south of town. The opening attendance is large.

B. D. Lindsay, of San Antonio, Texas, was in Nogal the past week looking after property interests. Mr. Lindsay is the owner of a large block of the Nogal townsite and was here arranging to place his lots on the market.

H. S. Wallace, manager of the Southwestern Mercantile Company's store at Capitan and postmaster at that place accompanied by W. M. Riley, passed through town Tuesday going to White Oaks on business.

While hauling a load of freight from Walnut station Saturday, George Slight, Jr., had an accident that cost the Nogal Mercantile company several dollars. The rain made the roads muddy and the horses could not pull the load out of the canyon south of Joe Vega's. George came to town for help and while absent a flood of water came down striking the wagon overturning it and its contents consisting of sugar, bacon, canned goods, rope etc., were washed away by the flood.

Parties going to and from White Oaks inform us that there are several places in the road that is almost impassible. There being at least four places where the banks are almost perpendicular, compelling persons to get out of their conveyances. 
