### CIRCULAR.

DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR,  
GENERAL LAND OFFICE,  
WASHINGTON, D. C.,  
February 10, 1900.

By virtue of the power vested in the Secretary of the Interior by the act of March 3, 1891 (26 Stat., 1093), the following rules and regulations are hereby prescribed:

1. The act so far as it relates to timber on public lands, as extended by the act of February 13, 1893 (27 Stat., 444), applies only to the States of Colorado, Montana, Idaho, North Dakota, South Dakota, Wyoming, Nevada and Utah, and the Territories of Arizona and New Mexico. The act originally extended to the District of Alaska, but in that respect it has been superseded by section 11 of the act of May 14, 1898 (30 Stat., 409), and which other and separate regulations are prescribed for the District of Alaska.

2. The intention of the act of March 3, 1891, is to enable settlers upon public lands and other residents within the States and Territories above named to secure from public timber lands timber or lumber for agricultural, mining, manufacturing, or domestic purposes, for use in the State or Territory where obtained, under rules and regulations to be made and prescribed by the Secretary of the Interior.

3. Settlers upon public lands and other residents of the States and Territories above named may procure timber free of charge from unoccupied, unreserved, non-mineral public lands within said States and Territories, strictly for their own use for firewood, fencing, building, or other agricultural, mining, manufacturing or domestic purposes, but not for sale or disposal, nor for use by other persons, nor for export from the State or Territory where procured. The cutting or removal of timber or lumber to an amount exceeding in stumpage value \$50 in any one year will not be permitted, except upon application to the Secretary of the Interior, and after the granting of a special permit. Except as above provided, it is necessary for actual residents to secure permission to take timber from public lands in said States and Territories for the purposes aforesaid. The exercise of such privilege is, however, subject at all times to supervision by the Department with a view to such restriction as may be deemed necessary.

4. In cases where qualified persons are not in position to procure timber from the public lands themselves, it is allowable for them to secure the cutting, removing, sawing, or other manufacture of the timber through the medium of others upon an agreement with the parties thus acting as their agents that they shall be paid a sufficient amount only to cover their time, labor and other legitimate expenses incurred in connection therewith, exclusive of any charge for the timber itself; but no person, whether acting for himself, as an agent for another, or otherwise, will be permitted to cut or remove in any one year timber or lumber to an amount exceeding in stumpage value \$50, except upon application to the Secretary of the Interior, and upon the granting of a special permit.

5. The rules specified in section 3 of these rules and regulations constitute the only purposes for which timber may be taken from public lands in said States and Territories, under this act.

6. The cutting and removing of timber, free of charge, under said act of March 3, 1891, is confined to unreserved, unoccupied, non-mineral public lands, in the States and Territories named therein, inasmuch as the act specifically pro-

vides that the same shall not operate to repeal the act of June 3, 1878 (20 Stat., 88), which makes provision, in said States and Territories, for the free cutting of timber on public lands that are known to be of a strictly mineral character for the uses named in said act.

7. It is further provided in said act of March 3, 1891, that "nothing herein contained shall operate to enlarge the rights of any railway company to cut timber on the public domain." Consequently, no timber may be cut or taken under this act from public lands either by or for the use of any railroad company.

8. Section 2461, United States Revised Statutes, is still in force in the States and Territories herein named, and its provisions may be enforced against any person, or persons, who cut or remove, or cause or procure to be cut or removed, or aid or assist or are employed in cutting or removing, any timber from public lands therein, except as allowed by law.

9. The Secretary of the Interior reserves the right to revoke the privileges granted, in any cases wherein he has information that persons are abusing the same, or when it is necessary for the public good.

10. All rules and regulations heretofore prescribed under said act of March 3, 1891, relating to the use of timber on public lands in the above-named States and Territories, are hereby revoked.

### COINING SILVER.

Treasurer Roberts informs a representative of the Chicago Record that under the new currency law nearly \$12,000,000 of silver bullion must be immediately purchased by the mints for the coinage of 10, 25 and 50 cent pieces. The new law requires that the subsidiary silver shall hereafter be kept at \$100,000,000, which is an increase of \$24,000,000 for the amount outstanding on the first of the month was \$75,425,413. The same law provides that hereafter all currency under the denomination of \$10 shall be stampered silver dollars or certificates issued upon them. Therefore all greenbacks and other notes of \$1, \$2 and \$5 are to be retired and silver certificates substituted for them. This will require the coinage of about 120,000,000 new silver dollars within the next year or so.

AMERICAN PLACER CO. Going into the Jicarillas.

Have Purchased 5000 Acres of Ground From the Jicarilla Placer Company. One among the biggest mining deals ever known in this section of New Mexico was consummated here last week, by the sale of 5000 acres of placer ground by the Jicarilla Placer Co. to the American Placer Co. ...

It was originally the intention of the Jicarilla Placer Co. to pipe water to the placers from the Capitan Mountains, a distance of 22 miles, but when negotiations were opened with the American Placer Co. ...

In addition to the drill, the company has ordered a hydraulic machine which is now in process of construction and which is contracted to be delivered in May. The hydraulic machine will cost laid down here \$30,000. The weight without the wood work will be 180 tons, and it will have a capacity of 75 cubic yards an hour; 1800 cubic yards a day. ...

ures would be insignificant. To handle this machine it will require 15 skilled laborers, working 5 on a shift, of which there will be three of 8 hours each. ...

The 5000 acres of ground will keep the company busy for several years to work it out, and their enterprise will be the means of furnishing employment to a large number of men and thousands of dollars will be spent as a consequence here and in the Jicarillas. The Jicarilla Placer Co. was organized by White Oaks people and the members of the Co. were Dr. M. G. Paden, Col. G. W. Pritchard and John A. Gumm. ...

The first locations were made by the Jicarilla Co. in October 1898, but in 1894, four years previous to the time when the Jicarilla Placer Co. came into existence, Dr. M. G. Paden and Col. G. W. Pritchard made a number of locations, all of which are now the property of the American Placer Co. ...

BANK ROBBERS CONFESS ALL.

Las Cruces Robbers Confess Their Crime - Accomplices Arrested But Released on Bond. Wilber and Wilson, the two men who were arrested at San Antonio charged with robbing the Las Cruces bank, have confessed their crime to the officers and implicated two other well known citizens of that city, who have been arrested, and are now under bond. ...

The confession was made to Deputy Sheriff J. N. Isaacs, who assisted Ben Williams in locating the men at San Antonio. On the train from here to Las Cruces Wednesday night, they told their story to Isaacs confessing that they made the raid on the bank, and that Will A. Cravens and Ponce Roads furnished the horses for them to escape. They paid Cravens and Ponce \$100 each for their services. ...

Cravens and Ponce were both arrested yesterday, but were allowed bond in the sum of \$100 each, which they readily gave, and both are now released. Mr. Isaacs says the men made a very clear confession, and that there is no doubt but that they are the proper men. - El Paso Daily News.
