The amount of such indebtedness being mentioned and shown in said schedule. Sixth to pay and discharge in full the indebtedness of said parties of the first part to the persons and in the amounts mentioned and specified in schedule hereto annexed marked schedule "C" Seventh to pay, and discharge in full. If the residue of said proceeds shall be sufficient for that purpose, all other debts and liabilities, now due or to become due from said parties of the first part.
